- Selects 75 securities from the Nasdaq US Large Mid Cap Index based on factors such as dividend growth, return-on-equity and earnings stability
- Reconstitutes annually and rebalances quarterly

Why VSDA?

- To help achieve income by investing in a portfolio of "dividend growers" or companies with the highest likelihood of growing dividends in the future
- To invest in those companies early in their dividend growth lifecycle
- To invest in a portfolio that seeks to grow the amount of dividends paid year-over-year

Average Price/Earnings (P/E) Ratio is the current share price of a stock divided by its earnings per share. **Market capitalization** is the total dollar value of all outstanding shares computed as number of shares times current market price. **Market price** is the price of the last reported trade on a fund's primary exchange. **Net asset value or NAV** is a fund's total assets minus its total liabilities, divided by the number of outstanding
